

Supported by the Green Climate Fund (GCF), the project aims to strengthen climate resilience and sustainable water management across the country.

The discussion, led by Mr. Fawad Hayat, Senior Director, Recharge Pakistan, along with his team, provided an in-depth overview of the initiative and fostered meaningful discussions on future collaboration opportunities.







Held on February 08, 2025, the visit to Lawa Olive Farms offered participants an inspiring glimpse into nature-positive farming. From organic cultivation to water-smart irrigation, the farm served as a living model of how sustainability and productivity can go hand in hand. The farms had implemented eight climate-smart agriculture initiatives showcasing sustainable and resilient farming practices.





The highlight of the visit was the flourishing olive plantation—symbolic of climate-resilient agriculture and a growing shift toward high-value, drought-tolerant crops in Pakistan.





RSPN, a valued member of the CAF, organized the Community Convention 2025 — to celebrate community-led development and resilience. The event brought together representatives from across Pakistan to share experiences, success stories, and innovations in climate adaptation and rural empowerment. CAF members participated actively in the convention, engaging in discussions and networking sessions while





showcasing their IEC materials and thematic initiatives at the CAF-designated stall. Their presence underscored the spirit of collaboration that defines the Forum and highlighted the growing role of civil society in advancing climate action from the grassroots to the national level.







HRDN, a proud member of the CAF, successfully led the World Environment Day celebrations at Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU) on May 30, 2025, in collaboration with IUCN and CAF. The event brought together students, experts, and institutions to promote environmental awareness and inspire climate action.
